**South Suburban Park and Recreation District to Present 2016 Proposed Budget;  
Community Invited to Public Meeting Oct. 14**

South Suburban Park and Recreation District is closing in on next year's budget and will present its 2016 proposed budget, including proposed fees and charges at its Wed., Oct. 14 board meeting. The public meeting will begin at 7 pm at Goodson Recreation Center, 6315 S. University Blvd., in Centennial.

The District uses conservative fiscal practices when preparing its budget, and staff looks for ways to improve efficiencies. While the majority of fees and charges for program participation and facility admission remain steady, some are proposed to go up in order to recover the cost of the activity and remain competitive in the market. The District's programs and facilities are generally self-supporting, and to that end the District is recommending increases in select program fees and facility admission. There are no proposed increases in daily admission at the District's recreation centers.

Copies of the proposed budget and fees and charges will be available for public review at the meeting. Copies also can be requested by calling 303-798-5131. Citizens will have an opportunity to address the Board, regarding requests for new programs or facilities or improvements to existing facilities, parks, trails and open space, as well as comment about fees and charges.
